A pilot program for the proactive recruitment of food, agriculture and UAS/small aircraft business to Kansas.

To match local Kansas communities and counties with potential growth opportunities, this recruitment program has been developed to enable counties and communities to voluntarily identify the areas of the food, agriculture and unmanned aerial systems (UAS)/small aircraft industry in which they would like to grow. These growth areas are aligned with the state's existing strategic growth plans for 19 unique food and agriculture sectors across Kansas. These growth plans serve as a guiding resource for strategic growth opportunities across the state.

A public or private entity or collection of entities representing a county/community which is seeking connections to growth opportunities will submit a recruitment package summarizing the desired growth goals of the county/community. By submitting a recruitment package, the submitting entity agrees to work with the state of Kansas to finalize and maintain up-to-date information regarding growth sectors of local interest and the availability of necessary natural resources along with other infrastructure, services, and amenities. The package will also include a summary of the public and private partners which are in support of this effort to identify growth opportunities for the county/community, and all letters of support from these partners.

The Kansas Department of Agriculture, in close coordination with other state agencies, will maintain an organized system to match potential business growth opportunities with the desired growth goals of the county/community. This will include working hand in hand with local leaders to proactively recruit growth opportunities that match the interests of the entities which have submitted recruitment packages

The Strategic Growth Initiative will allow counties and communities to indicate their desired growth goals in the food, agriculture and UAS/small aircraft industry.

1. Industry Sectors:

Nineteen specific agriculture sectors have been identified that have opportunity for growth in the state of Kansas. The submitting entity will select which sectors are of interest and identify specific categories of growth within each sector in which to specialize. Most of these sectors could involve value-added as well as production opportunities.

2. Supporting Resources:

While each agriculture sector is unique and may require different agriculture resources, there are some resources and infrastructure necessary to conduct and grow business regardless of the sector. The recruitment package will include an evaluation and description of current resources, infrastructure, services, and other amenities available as well as documentation of capacities or expansion plans for the resources outlined.

3. Community Leadership and Support:

Letters of support from community leaders and/or organizations should be included as well.

4. Official Letter of Submission

The recruitment package will include a written letter of submission, along with official dated signatures from the submitting entity.

Instructions for Recruitment Package

- Complete the Organization Information (page 4) in full, including all necessary contact information from leadership of your organization. A fillable pdf of this document will be available on the website.
- Complete the Industry Sectors form beginning on page 5, identifying which specific industry
 sectors you are interested in developing in your county/community. For more detailed

 summary documents of these 19 sectors. A fillable pdf of this document will be available on
 the website.
- 3. Compile a list of your supporting resources, using the outlined information beginning on page 7 of this packet as a guide to include all relevant information. Please adapt as necessary to customize your material to best showcase your county/community.
- 4. Summarize the community leadership and support for this project as outlined on page 10, including letters of support as available.
- 5. Include a written letter of submission, with official dated signatures from your organization.
