

Farm or Ranch Licensing Guide

The Kansas Department of Agriculture is devoted to the total support of agriculture in Kansas. While we must fulfill our statutory obligations, the department is dedicated to providing support and assistance to make Kansas farms, ranches and agribusinesses successful and help them grow if that is their desire. We also encourage more farms, ranches and other agriculture business to expand in or relocate to Kansas. This checklist will help guide you through various resources and requirements for opening and operating a typical Kansas farm or ranch. In addition to license requirements by KDA, other Kansas agencies as well as local or federal government agencies may have regulatory requirements to follow. Contact your local planning authority to ensure you follow all local business development laws, rules, regulations and guidelines. This guide is designed to assist you as you work to build and operate a successful farm or ranch in Kansas.

	Department of Agriculture — Weights and Measures www.agriculture.ks.gov	No license is needed from Weights and Measures, but a farm or ranch with scales or other weighing or measuring devices must hire a <u>licensed service company</u> to place the devices into service and test once annually if the weighing or measuring devices are utilized for any commercial transaction. 	Department of Agriculture — Pesticide and Fertilizer	Non-commercial application of restricted use pesticides for agricultural production requires a Private Certified Pesticide Applicator certification by passing an open-book exam. Contact the <u>local extension office</u> for more information.	Prior to applying pesticide
	www.agriculture.ks.gov	A Chemigation User's Permit is required for the application of pesticide, fertilizer or effluent by blending with fresh water through an irrigation system, and should be renewed yearly. To receive a Chemigation User's Permit, each applicant for a permit must be a Certified Chemigation Equipment Operator (CEO) or employ at least one individual currently certified as a Chemigation Equipment Operator. CEO certification is valid for five years. Pesticide products and commercial fertilizers must be registered with KDA to be legally applied in Kansas. 	Department of Agriculture — Division of Animal Health www.agriculture.ks.gov	Feedlots and dairies with a one-time capacity of more than 1,000 head must submit the cattle feedlot application. Swine, sheep and goat feedlots with more than 1,000 animal units must submit the swine, sheep and goat feedlot application. For a livestock genetic sale or any other occasion sale of livestock, submit the occasional sales application. If a registered brand is desired, visit the Animal Health Brands Program website or call 785-564-6609 to determine brand availability or to apply for a brand. Interstate shipment of livestock requires a certificate of veterinary inspection or other documentation. Consult the Division of Animal Health Import and Export Regulations for a complete list of requirements, or call 785-564-6601. Before exporting livestock from Kansas, contact the state of destination for their livestock import requirements. Testing for specific diseases may be required for some species. For a list of each state's livestock import requirements, visit www.interstatelivestock.com.	Prior to October 1, April 1 for Brands — Prior to shipment of livestock
	Department of Agriculture — Division of Water Resources (DWR) www.agriculture.ks.gov	The state of Kansas requires a permit for the beneficial use of water, with the exception of water solely used for domestic purposes. Domestic purposes means the use of water by any person or by a family unit or household for household purposes, or for the watering of livestock (less than 1,000 head), poultry, farm and domestic animals used in operating a farm, and for the irrigation of lands not exceeding a total of two acres in area for the growing of gardens, orchards and lawns. 	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Water, Livestock Waste Management Section www.kdheks.gov	Any facility that confines 300 animal units or more must register with KDHE. Animal units can be calculated on the registration form. The need for additional permits and nutrient management plans will be determined based upon the number of animal units and pollution potential. Additional requirements may exist if a facility of any size is considering composting. Contact Livestock Waste Management at 785-296-6432 for more information.	Prior to construction
	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Water, Industrial Program Section www.kdheks.gov	An NPDES Construction Stormwater Permit is required only if one or more acres are disturbed during construction. The permit is required prior to the start of soil disturbing activities (construction). Contact 785-296-5549 for more information.	Prior to construction
	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Environmental Remediation, Storage Tank Section www.kdheks.gov	Entities operating their own fuel tanks may be required to register with KDHE. Review information about aboveground storage tanks (AST) and underground storage tanks (UST). Review the KDHE Storage Tank Section website for further information, or call 785-296-1678 for permitting information. *The Kansas Small Business Environmental Assistance Program (SBEAP) has AST program highlights and registration requirements in addition to assistance with UST inventory control. 	Department of Health and Environment — Bureau of Air www.kdheks.gov	Gasoline dispensing facilities are subject to federal air regulation. A guidance document is available to assist in determining regulator requirements. Refer to the Standard Construction Permit/Approval for Gasoline Dispensing Facilities if applicable. Contact the KDHE Bureau of Air at 785-296-1570 for additional information.	Prior to dispensing fuel
	Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism www.ksoutdoors.com	Projects that involve public funds or government assistance, require another state or federal permit, or potentially affect a current listed species or its critical habitat need an environmental review . Call 620-672-5911 for more information.	Prior to construction
