Kansas Commercial Feeding Stuffs Law

Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-120 and Executive Order 18-13, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Feed Safety Program provides the following information pertaining to specific civil and criminal records that could disqualify an applicant from receiving a license, certification, registration or permit issued by the Department.

The Kansas Commercial Feeding Stuffs Law, specifically K.S.A. 2-1014, authorizes the Secretary to deny, suspend, revoke or refuse to renew a commercial feed license issued by the Department pursuant to the Act. The list below identifies various violations which may result in the denial of a commercial feed license issued by the Department.

If you have questions regarding licensure, you should review the Kansas Commercial Feeding Stuffs Law, K.S.A. 2-1001 *et seq.* or contact the Dairy and Feed Safety Program.

Additionally, you may contact the Kansas Department of Agriculture and petition for an informal written advisory opinion concerning whether your civil or criminal records will disqualify you from receiving a license, certification, registration or permit. Violation

The applicant or the licensee of any manufacturing or distribution facility is not in compliance with the provisions of article 10 of chapter 2 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, and any rules and regulations promulgated thereunder
