Kansas Dairy Law

Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-120 and Executive Order 18-13, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Feed Safety Program provides the following information pertaining to specific civil and criminal records that could disqualify an applicant from receiving a license, certification, registration or permit issued by the Department.

The Kansas Dairy Law, specifically K.S.A. 65-780, authorizes the Secretary to deny, suspend, revoke, refuse to renew or modify any license or permit or certificate issued by the Department. The list below identifies various violations which may result in the denial of any license or permit issued by the Department pursuant to the Act. License categories that are subject to the list below include the following: dairy milk distributor license, dairy manufacturing plant license, dairy milk hauler license, dairy receiving / transfer station license, dairy single service manufacturing license, dairy cleaning or sanitizing license, grade A pasteurized milk or milk product permit.

If you have questions regarding licensure, you should review the Kansas Dairy Law, K.S.A. 65-771 *et seq.* or contact the Dairy and Feed Safety Program.

Additionally, you may contact the Kansas Department of Agriculture and petition for an informal written advisory opinion concerning whether your civil or criminal records will disqualify you from receiving a license, certification, registration or permit.
