Domestic Deer Permits

Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-120 and Executive Order 18-13, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Division of Animal Health provides the following information pertaining to specific civil and criminal records that could disqualify an applicant from receiving a license, certification, registration or permit issued by the Department.

Specifically, K.S.A. 47-2101 provides that the Animal Health Commissioner ("Commissioner") may refuse to issue, renew, suspend or revoke any permit issued by the Department relating to the raising of domesticated deer. The list below identifies various violations which may result in the denial of any permit issued by the Department. License categories that are subject to the list below include the following: domestic deer permit.

If you have questions regarding licensure, you should review the statutes relating to raising domesticated deer, K.S.A. 47-2101 *et seq.* or contact the Division of Animal Health.

Additionally, you may contact the Kansas Department of Agriculture and petition for an informal written advisory opinion concerning whether your civil or criminal records will disqualify you from receiving a license, certification, registration or permit. See the Petition for Informal Advisory Opinion page for instructions on how to petition the Kansas Department of Agriculture for an informal written advisory opinion.

Violation

The conviction of any crime, an essential element of which is misstatement, fraud or dishonesty, or relating to the theft of or cruelty to animals

The person who is issued a permit is found to be poaching or illegally obtaining deer

The permit holder's willful disregard of any rule or regulation that is authorized by K.S.A. 47-2101 and adopted by the Department
