This letter is a follow-up to my correspondence dated April 10, 2023, regarding the United States Fish and Wildlife Service's request to secure water pertaining to its Water Right, File No. 7,571, for the Quivira National Wildlife Refuge, located in eastern Stafford County. You are receiving this communication because you have been identified as a water right holder whose water right(s) may potentially be administered as part of a plan to remedy the impairment of the USFWS's senior water right.

As referenced in my previous letter, my staff have completed a draft supplement to the 2016 final impairment report. That supplement was posted on August 14, 2023, to the KDA-DWR website at:

The supplement does not reexamine the 2016 final impairment report nor reach a different conclusion than that report did, which is that upstream, junior groundwater pumping regularly and significantly impairs the Service's ability to use its Water Right File No. 7,571.
