

Wildflower Walk and Pasture Tour

Wilson Pasture at the Northeast Corner of Hwy 77 and State Lake Road

Park on the Limited Maintenance Road east of Hwy 77 as conditions permit.

Come join the Geary County Conservation District and the Geary County K-State Research and Extension staff for the evening to enjoy the beauty of our native Flint Hills. With all of the spring rains the wildflowers are in full bloom adding an extra layer of color to an already stunning prairie landscape. Join District and Extension staff to learn the names of these flowers and the importance of this plant diversity to this vanishing landscape.

Bring your family, friends, cameras, sketch pads, closed toe shoes, guide books if you have them, lawn chair and a good supply of bug spray. We will be hiking through the pasture, up hill and down, but you can go as far or stay as near as you choose.

Staff will be on hand to help with plant identification and give some short presentations on the historical uses of the plants. There will be games to play and challenges to solve. We hope to have some of our local farmers and ranchers available to visit about good range management practices including questions about the annual spring burning.
