### Authorized activities with industrial hemp in Kansas (current program)

**Table 1**: Active licenses by type program; 2019 program licenses expired 02/01/2020.

License Type	2019	2020**
Grower	190*	214
Distributor	20	20
Processor	35	23
University***	9	7
TOTAL	254	265

<sup>\*</sup>There were 213 active grower licenses for 2019, but 23 licensees withdrew.

As of late May 2020, states (n = 41) have reported roughly 390,000 acres licensed to plant industrial hemp. Additionally, USDA has approved 47 state and tribal nation plans, however many states are not participating under the 2018 Farm Bill provisions for the 2020 growing season for various reasons relating to the IFR's requirements, lack of state statute due to a short 2020 legislative session or a lack of state regulations.

## Activities conducted by licensed growers in Kansas

**Table 2:** Acreage licensed, planted, and harvested as of 06/03/2020.

	2019		2020	
Activity	Acreage	# of counties	Acreage	# of counties
Licensed	~5,800	70	9,920	71
Planted	2,782	59	146	13
Harvested*	1,831	52	0.27	4

- Approximately 90% of the planted acreage in 2019 was grown for the floral material [cannabidiol (CBD) production]
- In 2019, 99% of the planted acreage was grown outdoors.
- As of 01/08/2020, approximately one-third of the Kansas growers sold their industrial hemp.




#### Developing Commerical Regulations
