# III. Surveys are done as time permits during the months of April through October.

#### IV. Outreach

- 1. Director meets with County Commissioners & County Attorney as needed.
- 2. Director meets with City Manager as needed.
- 3. Director publishes Public Notice every year prior to April 1st.

#### V. Prevention

- 1. Inspection of noxious weeds are done as time permits and upon request.
- 2. Director has very limited time for inspection of harvest equipment.

### VI. Training and Professional Development

- 1. Director attends as many district meetings as possible.
- 2. Director attends annual conferences for training and recertification.
- 3. Director attends safety training as required.
- 4. Director attends mandatory County employee meetings as required.
